## 2025 IMPACT

### Endowments Supporting Pastoral Care and Greatest Needs

Over the past five years, residents created two endowments—one for **Pastoral Care** and one for **Greatest Needs**. These funds provide ongoing support for spiritual care, wellness visits, and long-term nursing needs for residents relying on Medicaid.



### Education and Enrichment with Sheryl Buckley

Current resident and retired doctor, Sheryl Buckley, presented, *Stories from a Hospital Ethics Committee Chair*. It was well received at all six communities and sparked engaging conversation between the residents.

### Growth of the Living Legacy Club
