After much collaboration and guidance within the intergenerational group, a team of Aiden's friends and fellow Boy Scouts from Troop 734 transformed the butterfly garden. Hilde shared, "It was rewarding to see these young Scout members have an opportunity through Wesley Glen to continue the work that I and others in the Nature Committee care about."

After reciting the Boy Scout Oath, Aiden concluded, "Being a Boy Scout means staying physically active, morally straight, and overcoming different obstacles, and I think that's exactly what these residents do."
